Voltaire

This month's speaker at the regular meeting of the Humanist Association will be our President, Doug Peary, who will be giving a repeat performance of an earlier "Humanist Heroes" subject — Voltaire.

Francois-Marie Arouet was born in 1694. He came to be known as a young man as Voltaire. He was a playwright, who became aware of the oppression of humanity by the church and government in France. He spoke out and was published world wide regarding oppression. He became a businessman and paid his employees fair wages while endangering his own life by continuing to speak out for the betterment of humanity. He lived at times in England, Germany and Switzerland to protect himself from death at the hands of French and Catholic leaders. He also escaped to France from Switzerland to save himself from death at the hands of Calvinist Protestants.

Voltaire said that the creed of the Christian church was insane and filled the world with cruelty and fear. He made up his mind to destroy superstition and his cry was "Crush the infamous thing!" He became a national
