Has Death With Dignity Delivered?

The speaker for our regular monthly meeting Monday, March 19, at 7:30 p.m. will be Paul LaCombe, member of the Board of Directors of the Hemlock Society since 1999. His topic will be "Has Death With Dignity Delivered? A Humanist Overview of the Issue."

Paul's versatility as an artist and educator is demonstrated by his having taught foreign language, fine arts, and environmental science—all at the college and secondary levels. He was Founding Member and President of the Unitarian Universalist (UU) Fellowship of Paris in 1986-7, President of the European UU in 1989, and Secretary of the European UU, 1993-1996. He conducted a workshop on Death With Dignity at the UU General Assembly in 2000.
