## Anniversary & Potluck April 21 at 6:30 p.m.

For our 14th Anniversary celebration on Monday, April 21, we will begin with a potluck dinner at 6:30 p.m. Our guest speaker will be Tony Hileman, Executive Director of the American Humanist Association (AHA), the oldest and largest Humanist organization in the nation. He has chosen the topic "The Future of Humanism," a subject with which his work is intimately concerned.

A lifelong Humanist, Tony came to the AHA three years ago as an accomplished organizer and communicator, after a series of successful careers, notably as a journalist in Europe, the Middle East, and North Africa; an executive with Agence France Presse; and an independent executive coach. He coordinated the AHA's move to Washington, DC, where he issues Humanist commentaries on the events of the day and works to stimulate further growth of the Humanist movement. He believes devoutly that "the need for a strong Humanist voice in the national dialogue has never been greater than it is today."
