Death Penalty

Robert Nave, who is spearheading the fight to abolish the death penalty in Connecticut, will be the featured speaker at our regular monthly on Monday evening, November 15, at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden.

Connecticut presently has several inmates on death row, and one of them is scheduled to be executed early in 2005. Significantly, most of those awaiting the death penalty were prosecuted by a single zealous attorney in Waterbury.

Robert Nave, himself a life-long resident of Waterbury, opposes the Connecticut death penalty in his triple capacity as State Death Penalty Abolition Coordinator for Amnesty International USA, National Steering Committee Member and Northeast US Representative of the Amnesty International Program to Abolish the Death Penalty, and Executive Director of the Connecticut Network to Abolish the Death Penalty (CNADP). A member of the ACLU and its Connecticut CLU affiliate, he works very closely with the CCLU in the struggle to abolish capital punishment in Connecticut. A high school teacher for nineteen years, he is currently much in demand as a speaker on this important topic.

The evening begins at 7:30 p.m. with refreshments and conversation, followed by the main program at 8:00. Bring a friend!
