Complicity: How the North Promoted, Prolonged, and Profited from Slavery

Join us on Monday, April 17, at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden when Joel Lang will talk about slavery in Connecticut and the Northeast.

Joel Lang has been with the *Hartford Courant* since 1968 and since 1981 has been a staff writer for its Sunday magazine, formerly *Northeast*, now *NE*. Joel was the lead writer on a special 80-page issue of *Northeast* titled "Complicity", published September 29, 2002, which focused on Connecticut's involvement in slavery. Co-authored by Anne Farrow, Joel Lang, and Jenifer Frank, *Complicity* the book expands this idea to the North.

Noted slavery historian Ira Berlin recently reviewed the book in the *Washington Post*. He said, "This tough-minded book reveals Northern slavery to have been neither a marginal nor short-lived institution but a central element of the region's economy and society."
