Life at the Lighthouse

Feder, Ph.D., Professor of Anthropology at Central Connecticut State University. Dr. Feder calls this presentation, "Halfway between a wood-pile and a log fence: Life at the Lighthouse, Barkhamsted, Connecticut."

According to the legend of the Barkhamsted "Lighthouse," the community's first inhabitants were a wealthy white woman and an Indian man who had married against her father's wishes and then fled. According to a newspaper article which appeared late in 1854, the destitute village was inhabited by a group of Indians, the descendants of African slaves, and poor whites.
