## "Humanism And Action For Social Justice"

Humanists are sometimes described as "nonbelievers," but June Schafer prefers to focus on the positive—on what we do believe. At our January 17 meeting June will speak to us about the Humanist belief that we are all one human family, with a responsibility to care for one another. She will give a bit of the history of her journey from Wichita, KS to Hamden CT, by way of Minneapolis MN; New York City; Calcutta, India; and Bangkok, Thailand. In each setting, her Humanist beliefs led her to work within various organized community groups to strive for social justice or to organize new groups for that purpose.

For the past 15 years June has chaired the Task Force for Poverty and Social Justice of the Unitarian Society of New Haven, where her leadership has benefitted successive generations of children from the Waverly Townhouses in the New Haven inner city. She has also been honored by the Connecticut Secretary of State, who presented her with a Distinguished Service Award of the State Council on Vocational-Technical Education (SCOVE); the Interfaith
