Sheep, Spirits, Stars, and Massacres: Deciphering the Ancient Rock Art of North America

We're pleased to announce Ken Feder, Ph.D., will give another of his popular talks at our May monthly meeting at 700 Hartford Turnpike, Hamden, on Monday, May 18.

Ken says, "From cave paintings of Ice Age animals in Paleolithic Europe to artistic depictions of historical events by nineteenth-century residents of Canyon de Chelly, art provides a window into the minds and lives of past peoples. I have spent the last few years examining sites in North America where indigenous artists told their stories, leaving behind comprehensible messages about their world. In my presentation, I will share some of that art and propose at least possible meanings for some those messages. There will, of course, be lots of cool pictures!"

Ken is a professor of Archaeology at Central Connecticut State University, author of five books and the co-author of another. He has been the token skeptic on several TV programs.

We'll start with half an hour of coffee and conversation at 7:30 p.m. Ken's talk will follow brief announcements at 8:00 p.m.

Book Discussion: David Niose: "Fighting Back the Right"

We are very pleased to announce that David Niose, Legal Director of the American Humanist Association, will moderate this discussion of his latest book live via Skype on Saturday, May 16, 2015, at 2:00 p.m. in the library of the Unitarian Society of New Haven at 700 Hartford Turnpike in Hamden.

In this book, "Fighting Back the Right," Niose posits that a true "progressive policy should be synonymous with human-centered policy." Consequently, political struggle must first and foremost be an effort by real people to retrieve the political system from institutional, nonhuman interests, i.e. "corporate people." In making his argument, Niose reviews the historical trajectory that led America to this point, discusses how the anti-intellectual right and corporate interests in tandem have capitalized on these events, and suggests what progressive humanists must do to retake control of the country. (Hint: Overthrow the notion of "corporate personhood.")

To discuss "corporate personhood" and the structure/culture of governing power, there are also several (mostly short) supplemental readings for the discussion:
