Book Discussion: “The Great Agnostic: Robert Ingersoll and American Freethought”

Our book for December is “The Great Agnostic: Robert Ingersoll and American Freethought” by Susan Jacoby.

A biography that restores America’s foremost nineteenth-century champion of reason and secularism to our still contested twenty-first-century public square.
